Director Larry MacTaggart

Larry MacTaggart is a Senior Human Resources Coordinator at Leo A. Daly, an architecture, engineering, and design firm headquartered in Omaha. In this position, he provides a full array of human resources support to over 700 employees in offices around the world.

MacTaggart is a graduate of the University of Arkansas (BME-1981) and the University of Nebraska (MM-1983). He was director of instrumental music in the Fairbury (Nebraska) public school system from 1983 to 1985. He enlisted in the Air Force in September 1985 and served with The United States Air Force Strategic Air Command Band, (later, the Heartland of



America Band) at Offutt AFB. He was reassigned to The United States Air Force Band in Washington, D.C., in 1997, serving as a staff music arranger. In 2000, he was named Chief Music Arranger and Production Manager, a position he held until 2007 when he transferred to the Pentagon to assume duties as the senior Human Resources program manager for all Air Force Bands. In this position, he served as principal advisor to the Air Force Director of Public Affairs on personnel, recruiting, deployment, training, and quality of life issues for all Air Force bands. In 2009, MacTaggart transferred to the Headquarters, Pacific Air Forces at Joint Base Pearl Harbor-Hickam, Hawaii, where he served as Regional Human Resources Manager for the Air Force Bands of the Pacific. MacTaggart retired from the Air Force in October of 2012 and worked as a Human Resources Generalist for Berkshire Hathaway Media Group and The Omaha World-Herald. He is married to the former Jill Divis of Brainard, Nebraska; they have one daughter, Mallory.

Guest Conductor Michelle Bluford

Dr. Michelle Bluford, Director of Instrumental Music at Elkhorn South High School, is in her 19th year in the Elkhorn Public School and 31st year as a music teacher, including service at Benson High School and Ponca Public Schools. She received her Bachelor of Music Education from Morningside College and her Masters in Music Education and Doctorate in Ethic Studies from Covington Theological Seminary. Michelle is a clinician and adjudicator and staff member of the 402 Indoor Drumline. She is a staff member of the Nebraska Ambassadors of Music, conducting its bands on European Tours. She was a member of the Sioux City Symphony for 30 seasons. The Elkhorn High Student Council named her Outstanding Teacher of the Year in 2002.



Guest Conductor Lauren Milbourn

Lauren Milbourn is Assistant Director of Bands at Millard South High School and teaches beginning band students at Neihardt, Disney, and Hitchcock Elementary Schools. Lauren graduated from the University of Nebraska at Omaha in 2018, performing as a clarinetist and bass clarinetist in UNO's instrumental music groups and as Drum Major for the Maverick Marching Band. She also is Drum Major for the Nebraska Masonic All-Star Marching Band and is a staff member for the George N. Parks Drum Major Academy. She will participate in the Colorado Boulder Conducting Symposium and the Omaha Symphony's Educator as Maestro clinic with Thomas Wilkins, and this summer will perform with the World Youth Wind Orchestra Project in Schladming, Austria.



Guest Conductor Karen Fannin

Dr. Karen Fannin is Associate Professor, Director of Bands, and Assistant Director of the School of Music at the University of Nebraska at Omaha. Previously she was Director of Bands and Department Chair at Hendrix College in Arkansas, where she conducted the Little Rock Wind Symphony. She is active as a guest conductor, clinician and adjudicator and has had professional engagements in China, Sweden, Canada and throughout the United States. Her published research topics include pacing in rehearsals and performance, communication in music, and parallels between the ensemble and business. Karen has degrees from the University of Northern Iowa, Northwestern University and the University of Colorado.

Guest Conductor Chris Tucker

Chris Tucker is in her 32nd year with the Gretna Public Schools, serving as Director of Bands at Gretna Middle School and assisting at Gretna High School. Chris received her Bachelor of Music in Education with Highest Distinction and her Master of Music from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. In 1993, Chris was awarded the Jack R. Snider Young Band Director Award. She has presented clinics at both the Nebraska Music Educators Conference and the Nebraska State Bandmasters Association conventions and is a frequent adjudicator for contests and guest conductor and clinician for regional schools and honor band festivals. Chris was Associate Director of the Nebraska Wind Symphony from 2001 to 2012.



Marimbist Analynn Fassler

Analynn Fassler inherited her love of music from her grandmother and mother, who taught her to play the piano and surrounded her with musical instruments. She took clarinet in grade school and then began percussion lessons, enhancing her passion for music in high school and leading to music performance degrees in clarinet and percussion from the University of Arizona. After graduating and realizing she wasn't done learning, Analynn joined the Omaha community and obtained a Master's degree in Percussion Performance from the University of Nebraska at Omaha. Analynn has been a substitute performer with the Omaha Symphony, taught African drumming workshops for Visit Omaha, and has been a member of the Nebraska Wind Symphony since 2016.



Guest Emcee Jennifer Griswold

Jennifer Griswold joined the 3 News Now Team in August 2012. She currently anchors the news at 5, 6 and 10 p.m. She describes herself as a Midwesterner down to her core.

Jennifer is an Emmy-award winning journalist who came to KMTV from KSTP in Minneapolis-St. Paul, where she worked for more than six years. 






What IS the Nebraska Wind Symphony?

In September, 1977, Darwyn "Tony" Snyder, right, organized a group of 70 adult musicians and the Nebraska Wind Symphony, Omaha's Community Concert Band, was born. Tony and others had long recognized the need for a performance outlet for those who had spent years in high school and college band programs and would enjoy and support an organized group with which to play. We celebrate the vision of these founding members whose foresight resulted in establishing the Nebraska Wind Symphony!



The Nebraska Wind Symphony is an adult community band of over 75 adults from a wide variety of vocational backgrounds. For most concert seasons, the NWS performs three formal concerts plus other concerts in a variety of venues. This year there will be THREE free summer outdoor concerts. Reconstruction of the Gene Leahy Mall downtown means there will be no Thanksgiving Night festivities by the Holland Center, so the NWS will instead have a "Holiday Concert" at the Omaha Conservatory of Music on Sunday, December 8. The Nebraska Wind Symphony reaches out to young musicians, offering an annual scholarship and inviting area middle-school "All-Stars" to perform with us each year. 


