





Led by Brian Lund, trombone, the band features vocalist Renee Novak Rich.

Throughout the years, this big band has provided dancing and listening entertainment at private parties, dinners, dances, fund-raising events and concerts in the Greater Nebraska/Iowa Area. With more than 230 musical selections in the band's library, including ballads, fox trots, waltzes, polkas, beguines and other Latin numbers, there are lots of choices for dancing. 

We have enjoyed a wonderful partnership with St. Robert's over the years, and we are grateful for their support of the Nebraska Wind Symphony and of community music-making in Omaha. Today, we feature a smattering of music comprising repertoire from the NWS's 46th concert season as well as timely additions including a magnificent transcription of highlights from Andrew Lloyd Webber's *Phantom of the Opera*—a celebration of *Phantom's* historic 35-year run on Broadway. The march, aptly named *Cosmopolitan America*, served as the official march for President Theodore "Teddy" Roosevelt's presidential campaign, having been composed for the 1904 World's Fair in St. Louis. Interestingly enough, Butler served as a music teacher in Beatrice, NE during the touring "offseason." You'll hear many quotations from popular American tunes, including a rousing conclusion to the march of the *Star Spangled Banner*! Thank you again for attending, and we hope to see you at our upcoming performance at The Granary in Ralston on July 21.
